Summary of purpose and scope of report

In 2016 NHS England divided England into 44 areas and asked each area to work together across health and social care (NHS and councils) to develop Sustainability and Transformation Plans to improve care for residents. The NW London Sustainability and Transformation Plan covers eight boroughs and has 30 partners across health and social care. More detail can be found at www.healthiernorthwestlondon.nhs.uk

The purpose of this report is to update the Governing Body on recent progress in delivering the Sustainability and Transformation Plan and draw out key highlights from the last two months. Progress is articulated within the five key delivery areas:

- Improving health and wellbeing
- Better care for people with long term conditions
- Improving care for older people
- Improving mental health services
- Safe, high quality, sustainable health services

At the last meeting of the Joint Committee, the work being undertaken to develop the focus of our Sustainability and Transformation Plan was highlighted and the governance to ensure it integrates more fully with our statutory organisations –

CCGs, trusts and councils. Ongoing engagement continues and a progress summary is provided.

What are the benefits of this project?

Our aim is to deliver a shared health and local government ambition across NW London, in order to provide high quality, consistent services that reduce variation and promote best practice for our NW London population.

The Sustainability and Transformation Plan work adds value across our CCGs by:

- taking a long term view of health and wellbeing and making sure improvements to patient care are central to all our work
- forming a true collaboration of system learning and change across CCGs, councils and provider organisations
- gaining consistency in practice and standards
- reducing duplication of effort i.e. 'doing things once'
- sharing learning of local, national & international best practice

Patient, staff and stakeholder engagement

Throughout the report there are examples of engagement with key stakeholders and partners to co-design, develop and implement work, which includes examples of feedback and evaluation from patients on services/support. In addition, our proposed new areas of focus and governance structures are being developed with our lay partners and through active engagement with our all our Sustainability and Transformation Plan partner organisations. Arrangements are being made to hold sessions with each CCG Governing Body.
